Thanks to you, an almost-sold boy is now safe at Hope House

t age 11, "Prak" is a miracle boy. A miracle Ayou made possible by your compassion.

Prak grew up among prostitutes and drug addicts. His mom was the former. Prak's stepfather, a drug addict, often abused him. Worse still, the man talked of selling Prak to traffickers.

Thankfully we'd been closely watching. After our team tried numerous rehabilitation options with family members, it was clear that no one wanted or was able to care for Prak. He faced danger daily. Prak was often beaten with objects (including electrical wires) and food was regularly withheld from him. But Prak is now safe at Hope House, praise God!

He's since received medical care for wounds from the abuse, and went shopping for clothes and other necessities (he came to us with nothing). He's also started a new school. Miracle #1. Recently Prak told us, "I feel peace and love in this house." Our hearts burst! But there's another miracle in Prak's life. Read that story on page 4.

That wasn't easy for our students who live in the slum communities of Phnom Penh, as few kids have access to computers at home. So our team had to provide them with online devices and pay for internet.

Our Education Empowerment (EEP) staff also pulled in more teachers and stepped up tutoring hours to keep our students from falling behind.

As the new school year began, however, some of our older kids were allowed to return to the classroom part-time! While many still attend school online (until Covid restrictions lift), we're excited to see school back to some semblance of normal, and our kids studying hard.

Futures are being changed daily, and that couldn't happen without faithful sponsors like you!

Sophia*, 15, lives in a city slum community with her parents and 6 siblings.

Her mother collects trash to supplement her father's sporadic construction jobs. Sophia worries about how her family will survive, making it difficult for her to focus on schoolwork. Earlier this year she talked about dropping out to help support her family.

After learning of Sophia's struggle, our staff spent additional time tutoring

and mentoring her. We also encouraged her to pray, asking God for help. After a couple weeks she told us she changed her mind and is now studying hard and wants to stay in school. Thank you sponsor!

Then Prak arrived! The older boy immediately empathized with Prak and recognized how much they had in common. He knew that God had answered his prayer and took on the role of mentoring our newest family member. Miracle #2. Wow, that was fast!
