How visiting teams make a vital difference here in Cambodia

Our team plus a visiting team, working together to change lives. It's a beautiful thing!

Hosting a visiting team is one of our great joys! Groups come from different nations and backgrounds, but all have this in common: They love Jesus and want to help stop human trafficking.

We've heard lots of opinions about visiting groups over the years. Some

feel it's a burden; others say resources spent on tickets and travel would better impact lives by directly funding projects and on-ground needs. But for Extreme Love Ministries neither of those is true. Visiting teams are always a blessing in what they bring individually and corporately. Teams bring unique spiritual gifts, prayer, resources, time, talents and,

GOD'S SIMPLE PLAN

Jesus said the entire law fits into these two commandments: love God, and love your neighbor (Matthew 22:36-40). Wow — what simple yet profound truth! I often wonder what would happen if we really applied these two great commandments to everything we did, said and thought. What would the world look like, and how would we be changed, if we always put love first? If we really gave ourselves fully to love God and love people, we would in turn be "seek[ing] first His Kingdom and His righteousness" (Matt 6:33).

Loving our neighbor can be as simple as seeing their needs and "giving them a cup of water" (spiritually, emotionally or physically). When we do that we introduce them to the One who gives living water (Matt 10:42; 25:34-40; and John 4:7-26). We are God's mouthpiece, His hands, His feet ... we are the ones who show and tell of His love. And our neighbor doesn't have to live next door or even share our postal code; our neighbor can be the one in front of us, wherever our feet take us.

Missions can be a powerful way to see and minister to our neighbors. Whether or not your "Go" call to disciple nations leads you around the world, all of us can respond to the Great Commission by reaching out and loving our neighbors in our own backyard, within our spheres of influence or, for some, to step out and disciple in other nations (Matt 28:19-20). But discipling nations always starts with the one in front of us. Eventually that "one" will bring us to households, cities, regions and nations — but it starts with the one! And it starts with our response to build the Kingdom of God together.

Let's continue to join hearts in our call to LOVE ... let's love God and love our neighbor with everything we are and do (Mark 12:30-31). It is there and then that nations will be changed and come to Him!

perhaps best of all, passion! Time and again teams have proven to be a huge asset to our communities, outreaches and projects (and we could fill a book telling you about the awareness, testimonies and ramped-up passion they take back home!).

When teams come we actually are able to do more, multiplying ourselves to advance special projects, meet larger-scale needs, and minister within areas of unique team member gifting.

And best of all, teams partnering for a short-term mission experience end up becoming family. They often continue to partner from home in prayer and finances, and often return again and again to serve with another short-term team—or even return for a long-term missions assignment.

One was a church team from Erie, Pennsylvania (Erie First Assembly), and another was an international women's group (Women on the Frontlines). Both teams shared heart, gifts and experiences with kids, women and families! In addition, the prayer and intercession that came through unified hearts was invaluable, bringing breakthrough and healing to persons and nations.

One of our cherished times with both groups was a women's banquet where 100+ women from backgrounds of prostitution and trafficking learned about God's love and how He values each one. The teams brought testimonies and words of encouragement, and both groups heard the gospel clearly—in word and deed. Many came to know Jesus and receive Him for the first time!! We are still reaping fruit from the outreaches and powerful times of ministry and fellowship made more effective with the help of these teams!
